

Clarinet Fingerings Keyboard Visualization

Note: When a note has multiple fingerings, the bottom fingering is most common; the top fingering is least common.

 FLAT SIGN Go down one half step (or one key)
  NATURAL SIGN Cancels any flat or sharp
  SHARP SIGN Go up one half step (or one key)

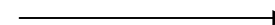
FLAT SIGN Go down one half step (or one key)
