



Saxophone Fingerings Keyboard Visualization

When multiple fingerings are listed, the fingerings on the bottom are more common.

 FLAT SIGN Go down one half step (or one key) ←

 NATURAL SIGN Cancels any flat or sharp

 SHARP SIGN Go up one half step (or one key) →
